## THE ROAD TO THE GAS TAX

On Saturday, February 23, 2019, the Alabama Republican Executive Committee passed a resolution by a margin of 61% to 39% against a bill raising gasoline taxes. Many members voiced concern over the quick movement of HB-2, the lack of information to the general public, the \$63 million that has been reallocated from road and bridge projects and wanted confirmation that these actions were a last resort.

The ALGOP resolution states, "...a current increase in implemented in 2012 (see chart below). the gas tax without reductions in the existing taxation revenue would be a move to increase the size and scope of government, redistribute income, and would violate the principles of our state and national Republican platforms." The legislators who tackled this issue ultimately cast their votes based on what each individual believed was in the best interest of their respective districts. It is their responsibility to share their reasoning for their individual decisions with their constituents.

To assure citizens that the funds are being used accurately and proficiently, the Alabama Department of Transportation will have a website devoted to the expenditure of these specific funds. This transparency will enable citizens to oversee in real time how their tax dollars are being spent.

While we celebrate the conservative work since the Republican takeover in 2010 - eliminating 6,000 government jobs, no education proration, cutting and combining department services, securing a historic high education budget with teacher pay raises - we ask our elected officials to continue to be fiscally prudent as they manage our state's finances.


#### Common Sense to Take the **Place of Common Core**

By a vote of 23-7, the Alabama State Senate passed a bill to repeal Common Core before adjourning for spring break.

After years of lobbying from conservatives, lawmakers took this very important 'first step' to end this controversial program.

The statistics don't lie. Alabama test scores have steadily dropped since Common Core was

Since that time, the Alabama Republican Party has passed three resolutions calling on the Legislature to repeal Common Core. The RNC has also passed a resolution calling for a repeal. ALGOP supports our teachers and giving them the tools they need to teach our children. The program is the problem.

After touring the destruction from Marine One, President Trump visited a relief center set up at the Providence Baptist Church. The president told area residents, "We couldn't get here fast enough. I wanted to come the day it happened."

The President pledged FEMA would stay on the ground as long as is needed. "We love you all. We love the state of Alabama," he said.

The First Couple then paused for a moment of silence at a memorial that had been erected outside the church. The memorial consists of 23 crosses which represent each of the victims that perished.


