BROADCASTING THE NATIONAL ANTHEM IN ALL PRE-K-12 SCHOOLS

WHEREAS, “The Star-Spangled Banner” is celebrating its 211th Birthday on September 14, 2025. This joyous occasion presents an opportunity to reintroduce the Anthem to the youth of the State of Alabama through broadcasting or performing the National Anthem in all public Pre-K-12 schools at least once per week; and

WHEREAS, The National Anthem and the story of its inception are a valuable piece of the history of the United States of America. Beyond that, the song is part of our nation’s patriotic musical history; and the Anthem is a symbol as important as the Stars and Stripes it references; and

WHEREAS, Singing the National Anthem at school and its sponsored events brings patriotic unity to the great melting pot of our peoples who are Americans; enhances the quality of the historic knowledge and awareness provided to the children of all ages; and honors the worthy sacrifices of the men and women who served and are serving in the Armed Forces in order to preserve our nation’s sacred heritage of freedom; and


WHEREAS, It is especially important to educate young people and new citizens of the United States about our cherished traditions and historic symbols, particularly the Flag and “The Star-Spangled Banner”; and

WHEREAS, Broadcasting or performing, at a minimum, the first stanza of the National Anthem at least weekly during school hours will invite students to participate in our history and tradition of singing the National Anthem with hands-over-hearts; instill a patriotic spirit in their hearts and minds; and inspire them to honor and respect those who are actively serving, the Veterans, and those who lost their lives in service to our great nation;



**RESOLUTION OF THE ALABAMA REPUBLICAN EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
IN SUPPORT OF LEGISLATION REQUIRING DHR TRANSPARENCY AND
DUE PROCESS RIGHTS NOTIFICATION**

WHEREAS, The Department of Human Resources (DHR) currently investigates child abuse allegations without a consistent notification procedure for parents; and

WHEREAS, This lack of uniformity has raised concerns about coercion, insufficient knowledge for parents, a high turnover of social workers, and inadequate due process protections; and

WHEREAS, The Alabama Republican Executive Committee recognizes the urgent need for reforms that protect children and uphold family rights; and

WHEREAS, We support legislation to:


- a) Establish best practices within DHR to ensure clear due process rights and written notifications to families.
- b) Enhance transparency and accountability in investigations, aligning with Article 1, Section 35 of the Alabama Constitution.
- c) Require DHR to implement uniform policies, including:
 - a) Written notice and detailed process outlines for parents at the start of investigations.
 - b) Information on parental rights and available resources.
 - c) Access for parents to review DHR documents at no cost, with necessary confidentiality redactions.
 - d) Clear procedures for administrative reviews and hearings to challenge allegations.
 - e) Regular training for DHR staff on investigations and family preservation.
 - f) Annual reports to the Legislature on investigations, training, and child placements; and

WHEREAS, This resolution aims to express our support for enhancing the integrity of child abuse investigations, protecting families and holding parties accountable; and


WHEREAS, The Alabama Federation of Republican Women (AFRW) has already passed a similar resolution in support of Child Protection Investigation Transparency Legislation in Alabama during its 2024 Legislative Days event;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the Alabama Republican Executive Committee urges Governor Kay Ivey and the Alabama Legislature to endorse and pass legislation that codifies best practices for DHR to ensure integrity in investigations and provide families with adequate due process and notifications.

REFORM UNACCOUNTABLE BUREAUCRATIC RULEMAKING IN ALABAMA

WHEREAS, Rulemaking authority is governed by the Alabama Administrative Procedures Act, and the Joint Committee on Administration is responsible for overseeing the process; and

WHEREAS, Under current law, an agency must give at least 35 days' notice of its intended rulemaking action, and all proposed rules must be published in the Alabama Administrative Monthly; and

WHEREAS, The unelected Legislative Services Agency (LSA) is responsible for maintaining the Alabama Administrative Code, and all final rules must be certified by LSA before they can take effect; and

WHEREAS, The Joint Committee on Administration may convene a hearing to disapprove the rule or send it back to the agency with suggested amendments. However, if no action is taken by the committee, it goes into effect at the end of the 45-day waiting period; and


WHEREAS, Other states such as Wisconsin, Kansas, Indiana and Florida have reformed their regulatory process to make the process more accountable to the taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, The ALGOP Platform states, "We believe that business growth must be encouraged by all levels of government through the elimination of all unnecessary regulations that unduly burden industry and businesses;"


NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That Alabama lawmakers should consider strengthening the current administrative review process to increase transparency and to lessen the consequences of new rules on the state's economy, businesses, and individuals; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, That before any regulation with a significant cost impact should be allowed to become effective, it should first be debated and approved or denied by the lawmakers elected to represent all Alabamians.

WHEREAS, There are outcries from across the state that parents are in agreement with President Trump's executive order; and




